Present mobility justice as a framework and vision for shifting migration narratives and systems of power 3. Discuss ways to contribute to co-creating transformative, justice-based narratives that bring to life what we are for rather than just what we are against <p>This workshop is also intended to feed into conversations on supporting civil society to be more proactive (rather than reactionary) in its migration-related advocacy.</p>
